

CASE STUDY: LIVED EXPERIENCE CURATION

BUCKINGHAMSHIRE, OXFORDSHIRE & BERKSHIRE WEST INTEGRATED CARE BOARD (ICB)

Context: This programme aimed to support people who want to find innovative ways of curating people's stories so that the ideas, messages and knowledge within them can be better shared with the people, groups and organisations in a position to use them to create positive change.

What We Did: We delivered Lived Experience, Co-production and Curation training to a team of community Occupational Therapists and Speech & Language Therapists, working with children. The training covered:

- Understanding how to gather stories using interviewing techniques.
- Analysing complex qualitative information
- Learning how to use media to share stories
- Use of filming, production and impact messages to influence change
- Gaining valuable research and evaluation skills

Impact: The 14 participants partnered up in smaller groups to identify themes to curate and film by the end of the programme.

Some themes emerged around waiting lists, universal early years service, the introduction of an advice line and referrals to services. We delivered three whole day training and coaching sessions with the group who then were tasked to create a short film for the following sessions where we reviewed their output. Participants learned how to curate stories from service users and learned how to film and edit videos. A member of the ICB communications team was at hand to support participants and used this training and potential impact to ask for further digital resources from the Trust.
